The McGowan Labor Government is delivering on its plan to keep the Goldfields strong, with the State Budget investing billions to create quality local jobs, fund a pipeline of infrastructure works and deliver key services like health and education.

The 2021-22 State Budget includes a record \$9.1 billion investment in regional infrastructure with only 9 per cent of this funded through Royalties for Regions. \$2 billion is being invested into electricity and water subsidies to ensure regional residents pay the same price or similar for these essential services and \$463 million for regional school bus services. \$4.2 billion has been allocated to Royalties for Regions over next four years.

On top of this we are investing billions into health, education, police and other key services in regional WA. We're delivering our Plan for the Goldfields to keep the regional economy growing, while delivering on our election commitments for the local community.

The 2021-22 State Budget is working to deliver a strong and vibrant region, with quality local services that give people every reason to live, work and raise a family in the Goldfields.

Delivering commitments to keep the community active, healthy and connected

\$19.8 million Regional Airfare Zone Cap to make airfares more affordable for regional residents

\$1 million to upgrade and expand Kalgoorlie's CCTV network

\$5 million upgrade to the Niels Hansen Basketball Stadium

\$2.1 million for a new Youth Precinct in the Kalgoorlie City Centre

\$1.2 million upgrade to Kalgoorlie Fire Station

\$14 million to continue the Aboriginal Community Connectors program, including in Kalgoorlie

\$17.8 million for an additional 36 career firefighters, including an allocation in Kalgoorlie



Investing in a quality education for young people in the Goldfields

- \$1 million for a new STEM classroom at Kalgoorlie-Boulder Community High School
- \$485,000 STEM upgrade and primary science at Kambalda West District High School
- Investment into science resources for Boulder Primary School, Kalgoorlie School of the Air and the region's District High Schools and Remote Community Schools
- \$35,000 for oval reticulation at South Kalgoorlie Primary School



Quality healthcare closer to home



- \$1.9 billion additional investment in health and mental health, with more doctors and nurses in regional WA
- \$1.78 million to employ a permanent GP at the Goldfields Women's Health Care Centre
- \$2.8 million to construct a therapy centre in Kalgoorlie for children with special needs
- \$19.7 million to PATS to expand the eligibility of patient support escorts and increase accommodation subsidies from \$60 to \$100 per night
- \$10.9 million to the Royal Flying Doctor Service to upgrade aircraft
- \$17.6 million towards social and emotional well-being services for Aboriginal people in the regions and \$9.2 million to extend Strong Spirit Strong Mind
- An additional five paid paramedics in Kalgoorlie and one in Laverton

Revitalising WA's TAFE sector and addressing skills needs

- Continuing the Lower Fees, Local Skills program, which has seen an increase of 32% in enrolments in the Goldfields-Esperance region in 2021
- Delivering the **\$10 million** new heavy plant and engineering trades workshop at **Central Regional TAFE's Kalgoorlie** campus
- \$25 million to WA TAFEs for new state-of-the-art equipment
- \$37 million towards the Employer Incentive Scheme in regional WA
